PROFESSOR VICTOR WEISSKOPF, MIT, TO DELIVER THE  
J. E. MACK MEMORIAL LECTURE ON SCIENCE AND SOCIETY

Victor Weisskopf, Chairman of the Department of Physics at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, will deliver the J. E. Mack Memorial Lecture on Science and Society at 4:00 p.m. Friday, April 25 in Room 1300 Sterling Hall of The University of Wisconsin - Madison.

Dr. Weisskopf is an eminent theoretical physicist who has contributed to many diverse areas of physics, but he is best known for his work in nuclear physics. Before his present term as chairman at M.I.T., Dr. Weisskopf served (1961-65) as Director of the European Center of Nuclear Research (CERN, Geneva, Switzerland). He was President of the American Physical Society in 1960 and has been an active member of the Federation of American Scientists, an organization which has been concerned with the problems of science and society.

Dr. Weisskopf's talk is titled "The Privilege of Being a Physicist". The public is invited.
